In a Friday night hassle, Conshohocken's Golden Bears host West Chester High in a Ches-Mont meeting at Conshohocken Community Stadium.

Other Friday night action will be found in the Bux-Mont League, where Ambler entertains Upper Perkiomen, Souderton travels to North Penn, and undefeated defending champion Quakertown

journeys to Upper Moreland.

On Saturday afternoon Plymouth-Whitemarsh High hits the road, making a journey to Spring-Ford of the Ches-Mont. Upper Merion also travels Saturday, visiting Maple-Newton. Bridgeport hosts Pottstown in Ches-Mont play.

In other tussles Saturday afternoon, all of which will get the green light at 2 o'clock, Haverford High visits Lower Merion, Conestoga is at Phoenixville, and Coatesville at Downingtown.

Valley Forge Military Academy will move upcounty to Perkiomen Prep, which is undefeated, while Pennridge visits Hatboro-Horsham, and Central Bucks clashes with Springfield on the Erdenheim field in Bux-Mont clashes.
