

Chester Aims To Give NHS Strong Battle Here Tomorrow

Unbeaten Eagles Can Clinch Suburban League Crown With 8th Straight Win; Status of Holmes Still Not Certain

Two ball clubs who have been 'firing up' all week for a vital victory stoke the same furnace tomorrow afternoon at Roosevelt Field. It's undefeated, untied Norristown High, determined to stay that way, against a rejuvenated Chester High eleven, confident of 'making' their season with conquest in this one.

Winner of seven straight games this year, and nine in a row dating back to the home stretch of last season, Coach Roy Kent's lads line up for the 2 o'clock kickoff on threshold of the Suburban One League title.

The Eagles could win it outright today, should Cheltenham upset Ridley Township. But if Ridley wins as expected, Norristown must win tomorrow to assure itself of the title. The locals are 5-0 in conference play, Ridley 4-1.

Fully realizing that Chester, winner of its last four games, is coming here equipped with talent capable of spreading misery, Kent said today his club would have to be at its best to "put this one in the ice box."

Fullback Charlie Holmes' ankle still is a problem in NHS offensive plans. The 210-pound, 6-foot-2 battering ram hasn't been able to go full steam all season. He's done a great job in spurts—then the old injury.

Scatback Bobby Lee came out of the Upper Darby game last week with minor injuries, but should be ready for full-time chores tomorrow.

Speed merchant Willie Suber, who has romped for 13 touchdowns to date, will be at the other halfback slot, with skipper Stew Percy handling the quarterback chores.
