

In Good Health For Haverford Game

Only Fullback Position Doubtful Friday Night; Bob Johnson Impresses

The Norristown High School football camp is glowing with health again, and the Eagles will be ready to resume scheduled gridiron activities come tomorrow night, when Haverford High comes to Roosevelt Field.

It will be the first outing for Coach Roy Kent's charges in two weeks. After winning their fourth straight with a spine-tingling 7-6 win over a Lower Merion team

unbeaten in 32 straight games, Norristown was idled by combination of sickness and inclement weather against Abington last week.

Kent reported his club in solid shape today, with possible exception of the fullback berth.

Big Charlie Holmes still can't go full steam on a bad foot — injured before the opening game and re-injured after he had smashed for the Eagles' lone TD against Lower Merion.

Dick Detwiler, sophomore fullback who has done noble work in support of Holmes, will be unable to play. Detwiler was the one boy who probably had the worst of the flu illness.

"If Holmes can't go all the way," Kent said today, "we'll have to do some shuffling back there in the backfield."

It was indicated that Stew Percy, the talented quarterback, may have to take over at fullback, with either Gene or Frank Bishop moving in at quarterback.

At his halfback positions, Ken is well set. Willie Suber and Bob Lee will be the starters, but Robert Johnson is sure to see plenty of action.

"Johnson, a senior, was one of the late starters," Kent explained, "but he has come along fast. At 5-foot-8 going to be a big help to us from here on out."

Along the line the Eagles are in good shape, and, from all accounts the same lads who played such great football against Lower Merion will be ready to dish out similar treatment to Haverford.

The forward wall would find Roger Adelman and Joe Bono on the wings, Capt. Bob Eastwood and Roddy Duckworth at tackle, Mike Branca and Robert Spens at guards, and Phil Knerr anchoring the line at center.
