

# Undefeated Norristown Faces Haverford Here Tonight

## Eagles Hope To Boost Title Chances Against Twice-Beaten League Rival

A Haverford High School team that started off the season like a field fire fanned by high wind, then fizzled, moves in against the undefeated Norristown High School Eagles tonight at Roosevelt Field.

The two old Suburban One League rivals line up against one another for an 8

o'clock kickoff, Norristown aiming to keep its record intact and enhance its potential for the league title, Haverford seeking to get back into the circuit fight.

While 4 and 0 overall, NHS is 2-0 in the league with an 18-0 conquest of Ridley Township and the 7-6 decision over Lower Merion. Haverford started out with a 36-6 clobbering of Chester, then lost a 24-20 thriller to Cheltenham and bogged 7-0 under Abington.

Norristown's other two wins were over non-league foes Phoenixville and Pottstown. A League game with Abington last week was off because of illness and bad weather. Haverford had a non-conference clash with Penn Charter postponed last week.

Coach Roy Kent will have pretty much of a full complement to throw at the visitors tonight. Only the full-back position gives him concern. Veteran Charlie
