

# Kenrick, Upper Merion Conshy, Collegeville Home Friday; NHS Away

Dedication and initial combat for its home field Saturday afternoon puts Plymouth-Whitemarsh High front and foremost on this weekend's scholastic football billing in Montgomery County.

Sharing the spotlight will be Bishop Kenrick High's return home to meet Lebanon Catholic, Norristown High's visit to Pottstown, and Collegeville-Trappe High's bid for a third straight win against Jenkintown on the C-T field all on Friday night.

Upper Merion, meanwhile, gets in the earliest licks, hosting Radnor High in a 2:45 Friday afternoon kick-off on the Spartan gridiron. Bridgeport and St. Matthew's are idle this week.

Plymouth-Whitemarsh requests the presence of Delhaas High as opponent for its field dedication game, and Coach Ron Landes' boys are out to atone for an opening loss at Ambler.

Kenrick High moves on to Roosevelt Field again Friday night, scene of their lone victory in three outings. They hope this one—against Lebanon Catholic—will get 'em back on the right trail.

The NHS Eagles, impressive in wins over Ridley Township and Phoenixville, move on to meet a time-honored foe in Pottstown.

Collegeville-Trappe, off to its greatest start in years with thumping wins over Bristol and West Reading, meet a Jenkintown team on the rebound. It has all the earmarks of a good scuffle.

And Upper Merion, which opened its Suburban Two League title quest with a dandy win at Lansdowne Saturday, figures to make it two in a row against Radnor.
