

# NHS Wins 7th In Row, Kenrick Nabs Title, C-T Unbeaten

## Eagles Clip Upper Darby, 20-13, Clinching In Suburban One League Race; Suber Romps, Bishops Score Early to Defeat Allentown, 13

Norristown High School's football team, tacking a seventh straight win on Saturday to its unbeaten and untied '57 string, stood only one victory away from the Suburban One League championship today—and that could be settled next Saturday afternoon when Chester High visits Roosevelt Field.

Roy Kent's Eagles clinched the tie over the weekend when they bowled over a pesky Upper Darby rival, 20-13, while second place Ridley Township was winning by margin of the extra point over Haverford, 13-12. NHS is 5-0 in league play, Ridley is 4-1.

Two drives of 80 yards and 66 yards, plus another one of those cross-country romps by Willie Suber—this one for 70 yards—accounted for Norristown's three-touchdown offensive at Upper Darby.

The Royals made a battle of it all the way, and when Joe Salvucci did a crazy-legs job for 35 yards and a TD in the second quarter the Royals only trailed 7-6 at the halftime intermission.

Norristown got two big scores in the third period to move ahead 20-6, then fought defensively to hold what they had in the fourth. But Upper Darby moved into the end zone for a second time shortly before the finish when an NHS fumble set up the opportunity.

Suber and Bobby Lee got the first Norristown touchdown in motion in the opening period. The Eagles put the ball in play on their 20 when Willie dashed for 13.

The two halfbacks joined fullback Charlie Holmes and quarterback Stew Percy in advancing the ball to the Upper Darby 42. Suber attempted a pass but it fell incomplete. Then Lee took a handoff reverse from Willie and Bobby scotted 34 yards to the Royals' 8.

The touchdown came three plays later—Lee two yards, Holmes for five and Lee for the score from one-yard out. Gene Bishop converted the extra point boot and it was 7-0.

Upper Darby lost no time retallating. After Bill Rode made a fine return of the kickoff to his 39, the Royals drove to the NHS 35, helped enroute by a 15-yard penalty against the visitors. From 35 yards out Salvucci made his electrifying TD run. The extra point was no good and the Eagles held the lead, 7-6.

NHS put the second half kickoff in play on its 20. Lee smashed for two, Holmes picked up five, then three more for a first down at the 30. Suber

ball downfield for 66 yards—and 17 plays after Meinick had made the interception, Percy slashed four yards for the touchdown. When Lee skirted around the left side for the extra point, the Eagles had a 20-6 cushion.

A Percy fumble at his 18 gave Upper Darby an early fourth period opportunity, but the Eagles dug in and halted the thrust at the 11.

However, Holmes fumbled on the first NHS offensive play, and Upper Darby again recovered—this time at the 15. On the fifth play from scrimmage the Royals scored when Roger Hayden moved into the end zone from four yards out. Bill Lites provided the extra point to make it 20-13—and short minutes later the game ended.
