

NHS Needs Win Saturday To Clinch a Title Tie

Only one victory away from clinching at least a tie in the Suburban One League race, only two victories away from clinching the title outright, and only three victories away from an unbeaten season, Norristown High was busy today preparing for the immediate job at hand.

That is Saturday's engagement with Upper Darby High on the Royals' gridiron. It's slated for a 2 P. M. kick-off.

While Coach Roy Kent's young Eagles are 4-0 in the league, Upper Darby rates only 1-2, its lone win a 14-13 conquest of Cheltenham.

Directly behind the NHS gridmen in second place is Ridley Township High, which has smashed to three consecutive conference wins after losing an 18-6 season opener to Norristown.

Norristown has Chester to play here on Saturday, Nov. 16, in addition to Saturday's test at Upper Darby. Ridley Township hosts Haverford High this Saturday, then visits Cheltenham for its league windup the following Friday afternoon.

Both leaders have seen one game go by the boards—NHS had to cancel with Abington, and Ridley had its game with Lower Merion wiped out by illness.

Lower Merion, which has only one mark in the loss column—that a 7-6 defeat by Norristown—
