

NHS Seeks 7th Straight, Saturday; Kenrick Can Clinch League Flag, Collegeville After Perfect Record

A Norristown High School football machine, which has been gaining momentum as the season progresses, barrels into Upper Darby this Saturday afternoon, seeking a seventh straight win in an undefeated and untied season.

It's one of the highlights of another heavy weekend schedule of football in Montgomery County scholastic circles.

Elsewhere, among the unbeaten, Collegeville-Trappe High figured to get an all-out fight of it, from Schwenksville High, also Saturday afternoon. The C-T Colonels need this one to finish out a perfect season and the Inter-County AA title.

Upper Merion, which carried an undefeated record into a game this afternoon with unbeaten Radnor, entertains its second foe of the week Saturday afternoon on the home gridiron.

A real neighborhood scrap is on the docket for Friday night, when the Golden Bears of Conshohocken High entertain Plymouth-Whitemarsh High at Community Field, Conshohocken.

And on Sunday afternoon, Bishop Kenrick High gets a shot at the Eastern Pennsylvania Catholic League crown, when it travels to Allentown Central Catholic. The Vikings tied the Golden Knights for first place when they edged Reading Central, 7-6, last week.

Outside of the county, but in a league with county members, undefeated Downingtown and unbeaten Conestoga go for Ches-Mont League lead Friday night at Conestoga.

Bridgeport High tries for its first win in a Ches-Mont League encounter at Phoenixville on Saturday afternoon, while Springfield travels to West Chester. A Friday night Ches-Mont tussle sends Pottstown to Coatesville.

In the Bux-Mont circuit, two Montgomery County eleven, Springfield and North Penn, get a shot at the unbeaten pace-setters. North Penn visits defending champion Quakertown, and Pennridge rolls out the welcome mat for Springfield. Am-
