

# Norristown Bid For Unbeaten, Untied Season Heads County Turkey Day Card

The scholastic football season of 1957 has but three more days of longevity, and Montgomery County schools are prepared to bid it farewell in the finest tradition Thanksgiving Day.

Heading the program will be Norristown High's bid to round out its first undefeated and untied season since 1923, when the Eagles entertained neighborhood rival Upper Merion at Roosevelt Field on Thursday morning.

Sharing the spotlight will be the annual Turkey Day grid

duel between Conshohocken High and St. Matthew's High for championship of the Iron-town.

An afternoon game at Roosevelt Field brings up another potential thriller when Bishop Kenrick High clashes with Bishop Eustace High of Camden. It is a reschedule of a game earlier postponed by the flu.

The Norristown-Upper Merion fray should draw one of the county's largest holiday crowds. The unpredictable Spartans of Coach Ogie Martella took some glamor off the game, when they were buried under a 41-6 avalanche by Swarthmore on Friday. Upper Merion has a 6-2 season record to throw against the Eagles.

The Conshohocken-St. Matt's game is considered a toss-up, although seasonal records might indicate different. Conshohocken, Ches-Mont contender, is playing better than .500 ball with a 5-4 ledger while the neighborhood Mirrors have only a 3-6 log. But make no mistake about it, this

size shoe has been worn on the feet of both teams before with some startling results.

When Bishop Kenrick and their Camden foe tussle anything goes. The visitors sport only a fair ledger, but they have met the best competition Jersey could provide.

Bishop Kenrick meanwhile will seek to add more glitter to their Eastern Pennsylvania Catholic League crown. The Knights are 5-3 on the season.

There are plenty of other Thursday headliners.

In the Bux-Mont loop, Ambler will grapple with Springfield (Montco) on the Erdenheim field, Central Bucks will host North Penn, Upper Moreland will travel to Hatboro-Horsham, defending champion Quakertown High will be the guests of unbeaten Pennridge, while Souder-ton rolls out the red carpet for Upper Perkiomen.

Bridgeport High meets contender for Philadelphia Public League title, Roxborough, on the latter's field at 10.

Conestoga will host West Chester, Coatesville will welcome Phoenixville and Pottstown will travel to pace setter Downingtown High in Ches Mont League action. All go at 10 A. M.

Other games will send Upper Darby to Haverford; Media, to Chester and Eddystone to Ridley Twp. All commence at 10 A. M.
